Inspector general probing police retirement system

The state office of the Inspector General and Attorney General is jointly investigating the Municipal Police Employees Retirement System, an attorney for the system confirmed today.

Baton Rouge attorney Randy Zinna said officers with the state Inspector General used a search warrant Friday and obtained documents from his office pertaining to golf courses the retirement fund owns in northern Louisiana.

Officials with the Attorney General and Inspector General both said they have launched an investigation into MPERS, but would not make any further comments.
