**Louisiana Inspector General Stephen Street
Begins Third Term as President of
National Association of Inspectors General**

Baton Rouge – After unanimously winning re-election at the annual Board of Directors meeting in Chicago, Louisiana Inspector General Stephen Street has begun his third term as President of the National Association of Inspectors General (AIG). Street has served as AIG President since January 1, 2015. His third term officially began on January 1, 2019.

Street commented: “In a time when Inspectors General across the country are increasingly in the public spotlight, I am honored and humbled that the AIG has again chosen to place its trust in me as President. It is a mantle that I do not take lightly.”

The AIG is an organization comprised of over 2,000 members from the Inspector General, Law Enforcement and Oversight communities of the United States, U.S. territories and several foreign countries.

Street has served as Louisiana’s Inspector General for 11 years. The Louisiana Office of State Inspector General (OIG) is a law enforcement agency with a statutory mission to investigate white collar criminal and public corruption cases, and to root out and prevent fraud and corruption in government. The Louisiana OIG primarily conducts criminal fraud and public corruption investigations, with an eye toward securing indictments and convictions.
